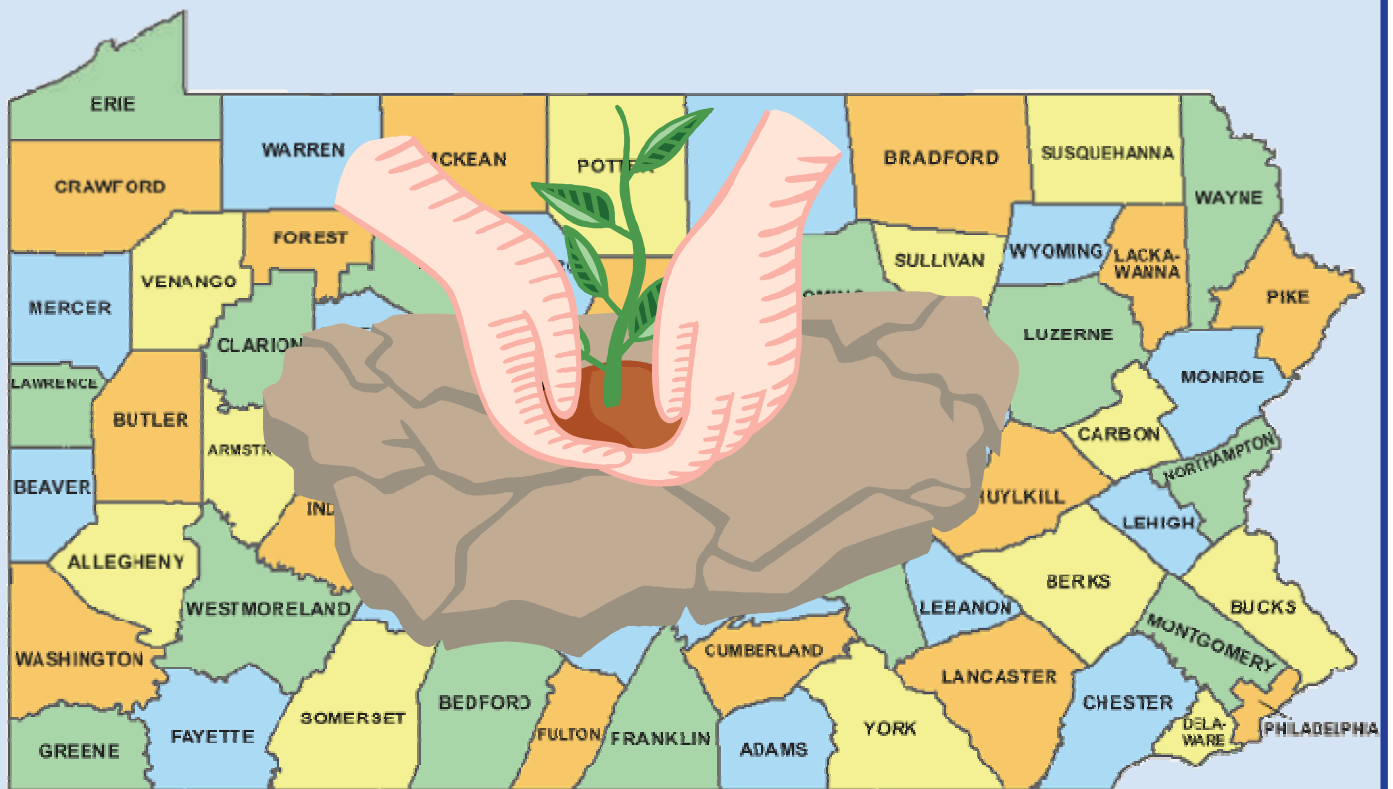

As the political landscape of the nation intensifies, it is not a season for the Body of Christ to be passive. In the coming year the United States Reformation Prayer Network is coordinating another Rt. 52 prayer initiative (Schedule on page 8). A 21 day Fast Forward prayer effort will begin on January 2, 2012, followed by each state taking a turn in leading the nation for one week in prayer and fasting. Pennsylvanians will lead the nation in this important initiative beginning October 8, 2012. It is also important for Pennsylvanians to be in prayer for the Pennsylvania Primary on April 24, 2012. A more comprehensive prayer strategy and list of updated prayer points will be added as we advance through the year. Meanwhile, please pray with other states as you feel led, the Iowa Caucus will kick off the Presidential Campaign on January 3, 2012.

It is righteousness that exalts a nation. As you join others around the nation in this critical season to shift the spiritual atmosphere of our nation and urge political leaders to align with righteousness, we invite you to consider how you may take an active part in encouraging others to get out the vote. We're all thinking about the Presidential and Congressional elections this year. While the Presidential and Congressional elections dominate the political horizon, we must remain vigilant on the local level so that we will not lose the battle in our own backyard.

In the pages that follow you will find important information concerning the governmental elections in 2012. This information will help you know how you can stay informed on the position and voting record of your local, state, and national political candidates, as well as how you can position yourself in prayer and sounding your voice for righteousness. Psalms 81:10 says, I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt; open your mouth wide, and I will fill it. The Lord is watching over His word to perform it.

Pennsylvania is a swing state with numerous independent voters as well as conservative democrats. Many political experts are indicating that Pennsylvania's political

landscape in 2012 will be critical for our current President to retain the White House.

As drilling for natural gas increases in the large Marcellus Shale formation that underlies much of Pennsylvania, as well as portions of neighboring states, this issue has helped to fuel the national influence our state will have in the days ahead.

Named in honor of the state's founder William Penn and the Latin word "sylvania" meaning woods, Pennsylvania means "Penn's woods". Pennsylvania is frequently referenced as The Keystone State because of the state's central geographic location within the original [13 colonies](#). The state has historically held a key position in the economic, social, and political development of our country. Pennsylvania's state anthem references the state as being the "Birthplace of a mighty nation, Keystone of the land." The connotation of the word *keystone* is derived from architecture, describing the central wedge shaped stone in an arch which holds all the other stones in place.

William Penn's dream and vision was that our state would be the seed of holiness in the nation that would also establish and demonstrate covenant with God and one another. While significant broken covenants took place in Pennsylvania, we believe that the prophetic destiny of our state is to prepare the way for the Father God to reconnect, revive, reveal His heart toward man and restore covenant with Him. Pennsylvania is a birthing state and we carry a mantle to establish righteous government and set a holy example for the nation.

We will regularly update this information as necessary and hope you will keep us informed on the prayer needs of your region. To share prayer needs for your region email nmhess@comcast.net. Additionally, as part of this important initiative, we encourage you to continue pursuing the Father's heart in your own life. Know that as you pray with us we will also be praying with, and for you. Key State Issue in 2012:

With 20 electoral votes, Pennsylvania will be the last of the “big three” presidential battleground states to hold its Presidential primary. During the tour, journalists will cover energy, environment, manufacturing and job creation issues in addition to covering the April 24 presidential primary.

In the story of Esther we find that the enemy had entered in the gates and was planning to overthrow the covenant blessings that God had for His people. In the book of Esther, Mordecai had exposed the enemy’s plan and taken his authority to the gate of the city. The Lord says in Matthew 16: 18, *“And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it.”* We can not allow evil to prevail at our gates. Esther is a book about seeing the destiny of God’s covenant manifest by legislating authority at the gates. The gate of a city was where all business transactions and legal matters occurred.

Listed below are some of the relevant state issues you can expect to be hearing more about in 2012.

- The state has been a focal point in national news with the recent Penn State University scandal. Pennsylvania’s justice is fledgling as University leaders scramble to restore their campus image. The best hope for change is to agree with God by declaring His word. The Nittany lion has fallen, it is time for Lion of Judah to arise in Lion country. State College is located in The Seven Mountains region, in Center County. This is a prophetic picture of the significant role Center County will play in transforming the nation. Many intercessors have already recognized the Importance this key will be to unlocking the gates to a Godly kingdom. C.Z. - Rep. Rose Marie Swanger of Lebanon County has introduced House Bill 2029, which would amend Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, prohibiting “the application of foreign law which would impair constitutional rights.” Her bill is being supported by more than 40 state reps in order to protect the [commonwealth Islamic Jihad within the walls of state government](#).
- Consensus regarding the natural gas extraction of Marcellus Shale and the severance tax.
- Decision on Voter id law.
- A Pennsylvania Marriage Amendment may appear on the [November 2013](#) statewide ballot as a [legislatively-referred constitutional amendment](#). The proposed measure would define marriage as a union between one man and one woman. The bill was introduced in the [House](#) on [May 3, 2011](#) by [Rep. Daryl Metcalfe](#).

Prayer Preparation and Instructions:

As you remain steadfast in prayer for our state and nation, we have provided below some pointers on how you can maximize this time in your own faith walk and personal journey toward greater intimacy with Father God.

- Read through our prayer points, and suggested scriptures in advance, and listen for the Holy Spirit to give you additional scriptures and revelation. As you pursue the Father's heart, know that He is also pursuing yours.
- Incorporate daily worship into your routine, especially before you begin your prayer time. Ephesians 2:6 says that "God raised you up with Christ and seated you with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus." Once you have risen in worship know that you sit at the right hand of the Father. You are a joint heir with Christ and the sound of your voice is being released from the throne room. The life breath of God is released from heaven into the earth realm as you declare His glory.
- Allow the Holy Spirit to search your heart personally for things you may need to be in repentance for personally and corporately in your region.

In Philippians 3:12-15 Paul says that God will reveal to the Philippians any incorrect thinking or attitudes. Moreover, he suggests it is God who enables the process of sanctification in our lives. David says in Psalm 139:23-24 "Search me, O God. . . ." suggesting that we need to ask Holy Spirit to search us and show us our sins. In I John 1:7-9 we see that as we walk in the light of God's presence, exposing every thing to Him, that His light will expose our sins so that we can be cleansed. This picture of walking in the light and confessing our sins to the Lord on an ongoing basis is written to believers, alluding that God will continually reveal sin in our lives, past and present, which we need to confess and be cleansed of.

Identificational repentance is also a means of releasing God's grace on a corporate level to others which may move them to repent more freely of their personal sins and turn to Christ. Scripture shows us examples of this in the accounts of Jesus' prayer for his persecutors on the cross, and the prayers of Ezra, Nehemiah, and Moses for God's people and for pagans.

- Psalms 23:5 says that the Lord prepares a table for you in the presence of your enemies. After you have allowed the Spirit to search your heart and repented appropriately. it is a good time to re-covenant with the Lord through personal communion. As you affectionately remember his sacrifice it becomes yours, He anoints your head with oil and your cup overflows. Consider the practice of personal communion on a regular basis as you feel led by the Holy Spirit and appropriate the blood of Jesus over yourself and your household.
- Put on the full armor of God according to Ephesians 6:10-18. Boldly pick up your shield of faith and begin to identify the arrows that have been hindering you from moving forward in your own destiny. Identify ungodly beliefs that do not align with the truth of God's word and ask the Lord to reveal His heart for you.

- The word encourages us to declare the kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven. Find a private place to declare in an audible voice the decrees and declarations that are suggested, as well as the scriptures. Feel free to write and decree your own declarations and share them with us. "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they reveal knowledge. (Psalms 19:-2)
- Plan a daily prayer time of an hour or two if possible during the PA Route 52 initiative, however, if this does not work for you, follow your daily focus as it best fits your daily schedule.
- If possible invite other intercessory friends to touch and agree with you in prayer for your neighborhood and region. The Daily prayer targets are suggested for your convenience and are not intended to be an exhaustive list. "Though one may be overpowered by another, two can withstand him. And a threefold cord is not quickly broken." (Ecclesiastes 4:12)
- If you enjoy walking, prayer walk the land in your neighborhood and community and speak blessings over your household and your neighbors households. King David blessed the house of Obed-Edom and all that belonged to him because of the presence of the ark of God. That is because the Ark contained the presence of God. Where God's presence dwells there is glory and hope. The presence of God is within you and every place you place your feet you leave a deposit of the glory of the Father. When we bless the households of your community you make room for the Lord to take up residence in every household.
- Regularly check the website for updates, personal encouragement and additional insight.

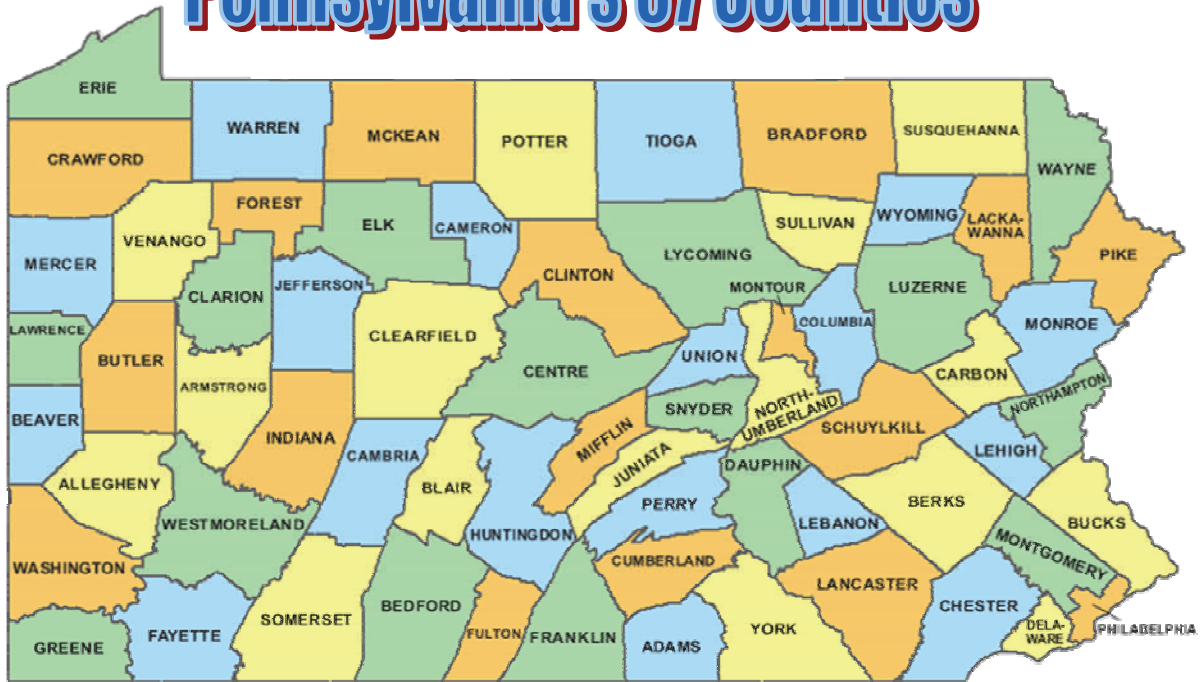
